The contribution of J. E. Schofield and H. Loft to Almondbury Wesleyans C.C. was recognised in 1950.

Both had given longstanding service as administrators, with Loft occupying the treasurer's position for 19 years and Schofield acting first as treasurer for 6 years, which were followed by 19 years as secretary.
