Win Holden Cup for second time, beating Penistone Netherfield in a match that lasted till the Wednesday due to bad weather. Cartworth Moor 94, Penistone Netherfield 87 (J. Wakefield 5 for 31 and I. Swallow 4 for 28). Fortunately, Penistone's captain and no.4 R. Windle couldn't bat due to work commitments!	1939	Beginning of Second World War.
In the Central League's annual 'Champions v Rest' match, the Rest included Cartworth Moor's F. Moorhouse.	1940	National Government formed.

	1944	The last of the Great Floods. Called the 'Forgotten Flood' because it occurred a few days before the Allied invasion of Normandy. There was a news blackout at this time and it was ten days later when the flood was reported. By the time it was reported it was a minor event - the news being all about the Allied invasion. D-Day. Paris liberated.

Lose Holden Cup final to Scholes. Chasing 227, Cartworth Moor could only manage 196 with Fred Battye making 62 and E. Beaver 46.	1948	State of Israel founded.

Reach Tinker Cup final, helped by ex-Yorkshire and Northamptonshire star Freddie Jakeman, aged 53! Emley win by 2 wickets even though Jakeman scores a half century and H. Bowden takes 5-33 for Cartworth Moor.	1973	Britain enters EEC. VAT introduced.
Win Tinker Cup final v Skelmanthorpe. Match is tied – 117 runs apiece. In the replay Cartworth Moor total 148-9 and win by 24 runs. Moor also win Section C of the Central League and J. Watmough wins the League's Section C & D Fielding Prize with 14 catches.	1974	Nixon resigns over Watergate.
