

Kirkheaton CC Rules revised Nov. 17th, 1880. **Confirmed Feb. 14th, 1881.**

- I. That the Club be called KIRKHEATON CRICKET CLUB.
2. That the Government of the Club be entrusted to President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, two Secretaries and a Committee of Thirteen.
3. That the Committee have power to divide into Sub-Committees as they think fit for the management of the Club.
4. The President, or in his absence a Vice-President, shall preside at all meetings, and have the casting vote in addition to his own vote.
5. That the Committee have power to expel any member whose conduct may be detrimental to the interests of the Club,. Such a member however to have the right to appeal to the next Special or General Meeting.
6. That the Committee meeting be held in the Church School every Monday evening at 8-30 p.m., and that if any member does not appear for three meetings in succession without a satisfactory reason the Committee shall have power to elect another in his place.
7. That the Committee have power to call the Annual Meeting at their own discretion.
8. That the entrance fee be 2/6 and the Contributions of members be 2d. per week in the playing season, and yd. per week in the winter, the Entrance Fee to be paid before playing.
9. That if any member's arrears exceed one shilling he shall cease playing in matches, or practicing, or voting at any meetings, until arrears be paid.
10. Any member paying one guinea per year shall be entitled to play in matches, and in practice to follow (on his entering the field) the 1st retiring batsman every evening.

Any member paying 10/6 per year shall be entitled to play in matches, and in practice to follow as above on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Any member paying 7/6 per year shall be entitled to play the same as any other ordinary member,

II. That members have an inning of 30 balls each in practice and that no more than 3 balls be used in practicing.

In March, 1886, Rules 8 and 9 were amended as follows: 8. That the entrance fee... be paid before playing, that Contributions were to be 6/- per year, and that they could be paid in 3 instalments on April 19th, May 31st, July 5th.

9. Any member being in arrears shall not be allowed to play, practice, or vote at any meeting in connection with the Club.

These amendments were very necessary. At the end of 1885 the Contributions were in such a state of arrears that it was inevitable that some alteration would have to be made, and so instead of the weekly contribution a yearly subscription was introduced in March 1886.
