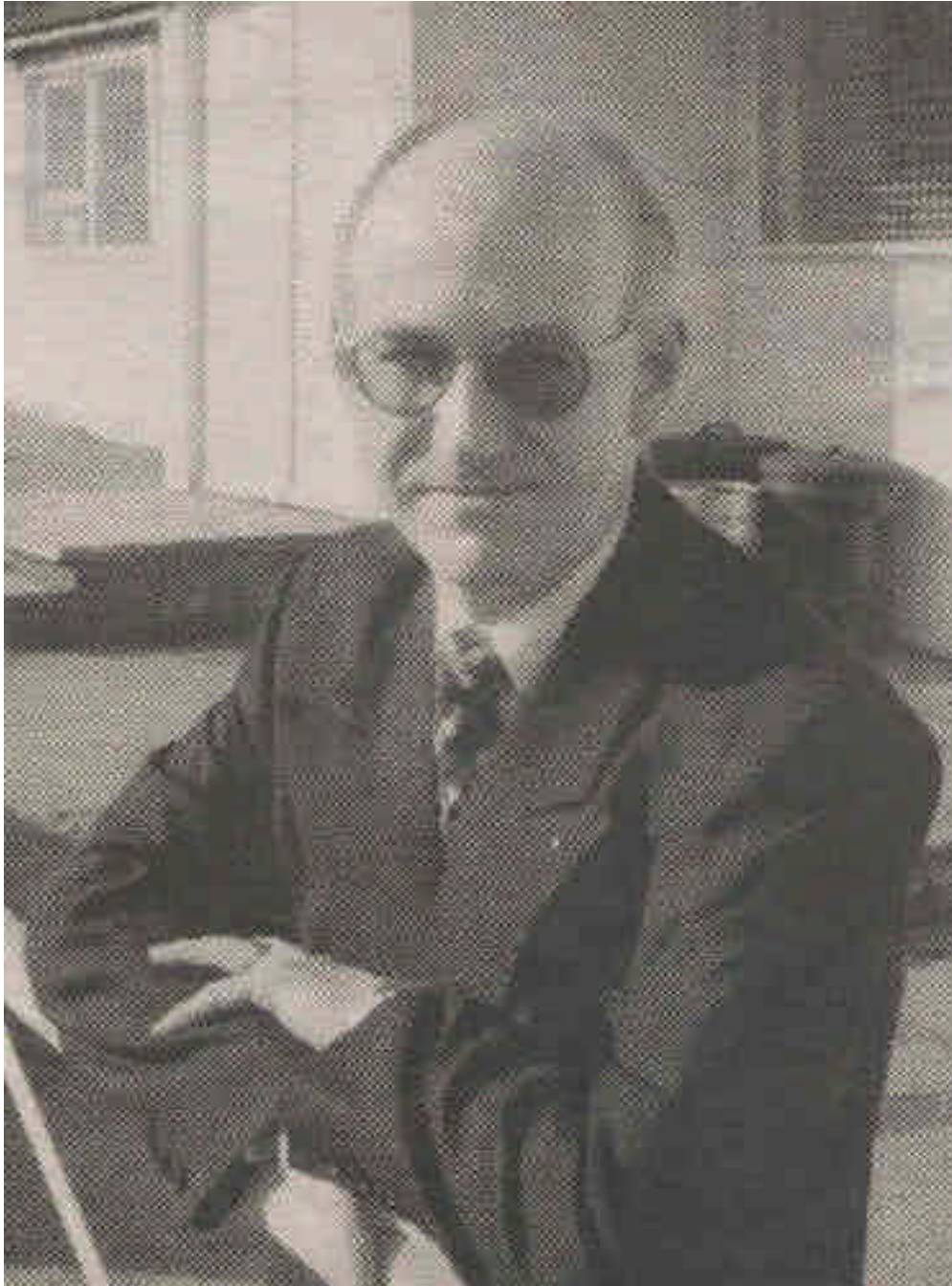
WHO'S WHO

FRANK EXLEY



Frank Exley was known as ‘Mr Nortonthorpe’. He played in all Nortonthorpe’s successful teams from 1940 until the 1960s and was also a tireless worker for the Club. After taking over as ‘temporary groundsman’ in 1949, he held the post for 32 years.

Rowland Hardy was captain of the 1st XI
in the early 1960s.

Geroge Norton, who owned Nortonthorpe Mill, provided the Club with its current ground.

NORMAN MOSLEY



In 1995, 34 years after playing in the 1961 championship-winning side, Norman Mosley was still involved with the Club as an umpire.

THE BENTLEYS



Brothers Noel and Ernest Bentley were Club umpires in the 1961 Allsop Cup-winning season, while their nephew Dennis also played in the side. Dennis appeared in a total of three Allsop Cup finals and was 'not out' in all three, scoring half centuries on two occasions.

Adrian Whittaker is President of the Huddersfield Central Cricket League, and also Nortonthorpe's hardworking groundsman.
