PRIMROSE HILL CRICKET CLUB.

PRESENTATION OF MEDALS.

In connection with the presentation of the medals secured by both elevens of the Primrose Hill C. and A. C. in the Central Cricket League, a concert was held in the United Methodist Church Schoolroom, Primrose Hill, on Saturday evening last, before a good muster. The chair was taken by Mr. Robert Lodge, the president of the club. There were also present Messrs. Schofield Haigh, W. E. Bates, Herbert Haigh (Lockwood professional, and a former member of Primrose Hill C.C.A.), P. Oldfield (president of the Central League), J. J. Whitaker (St. Andrew's representative), J. W. Brearley (Salendine Nook representative), and Councillor Lawton. Messrs. G. H. Hirst, A. Drake, W. Rhodes, P. Holmes, and C. E. Bentley wrote expressing regret at their inability to attend.

Mr. Harry Clayton, Misses F. and H. Cardwell, Mr. G. D. Holroyd (humourist), Mr. H. Whittaker (accompanist), and a party of children trained by Mr. J. A. Balidon contributed to the success of the musical part of the programme.

An apology was read from the firm supplying the medals, who said that they had not been able, owing to shortened working hours, to send the medals as promised in time for the presentation. Mr. Schofield Haigh was thus relieved of the duty of presenting two sets of medals, and instead presented the fielding medals given by Councillor F. Lawton (first eleven), and Mr. R. Lodge (second eleven). The fielding medals were received by W. Smithies and G. D. Holroyd respectively.

In making the presentation, Mr. Haigh remarked that he had the honour to be a member of a club that had won the championship of the Alliance League in the first year of its inception, and of the Council League, and had won the Lumb Cup when it was first offered. Primrose Hill had the honour of securing a double event in the first year of the new Central League. For his part, he would have liked to see the twenty-four or so clubs in Huddersfield premier cricket playing one another.

Mr. C. E. Holroyd, in proposing a vote of thanks to Mr. S. Haigh, mentioned that a few years ago an attempt was made to re-model Huddersfield cricket, but unfortunately it failed. He also referred to Herbert Haigh as a breaker of two records, who scored 1,264 runs in League cricket this season, and, with the help of D. Hockley put on 51 runs.

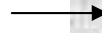
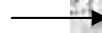
Councillor Lawton seconded the vote of thanks.

Mr. Haigh, in responding, said he hoped that out of the young players there would be one to take his place in the county team. At any rate, he would like to see another player from Huddersfield in the county team.

A vote of thanks to the chairman, proposed by Mr. C. E. Holroyd, and seconded by Mr. J. Hinchliffe, was carried unanimously.

Mr. Lodge, in replying, said the only reward he wished for was that the young men of Primrose Hill would rally round the cricket club, and keep it at the top of the League next year.

Thanks were accorded the artists, and the concert was brought to a close with a rendering of the Belgian, French, Russian, and English National Anthems by the children.
